A suggestion was made to set the official start of term date to January 1 with a statement that there will be a transition period between the end of the Annual meeting and the end of the calendar year where the outgoing chair coordinates the transition with the incoming chair.

Once the review process is complete, the new bylaws can kick in at any point in the calendar year.

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








• Historical high year-end balance in 2021

Membership Dues Trend






• Flat trend over last 4 years

- · Nomination deadline to coincide with established deadlines for awards to be presented at the AIChE's fall annual meeting.
- · Current office holders of the Separations Division leadership are eligible for this award, if other criteria are also met.
- · Nominations will remain active as long as the candidate is eligible. Nominators are strongly encouraged to update their information and supporting letters regularly.
- This award may only be awarded to the same individual only once. Up to four supporting letters are required. To facilitate the review process, the preferred format for Nomination Packages is electronic, in ".pdf" format. If you wish to submit a Nomination Package in any other format, electronic or print, please contact the Separations Division. 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Proposed GSRA Award Wording: Provide for self nomination

For consideration for the award, the following should be submitted:

- 1. A single paper contributing to separations fundamentals or applications. This paper may be co-authored by others, but the student nominee must have been the primary author. The paper should be of a quality acceptable for publication in journals such as the AIChE Journal or Chemical Engineering Science.
- 2. A single letter of support detailing the student's strengths and accomplishments, written by a person familiar with the work and preferably a faculty member, who must be a member of AIChE.

Current:

- 2. a single nomination letter detailing the student's strengths and accomplishments, written by a faculty member, who must be a member of AIChE.
- 3. The student's CV

To be eligible for this year's awards, the nominees must currently be graduate student or have graduated since the last AIChE Annual meeting. Nominations are due May 1st.

The selection criteria include:

- 1. The paper must report on research, investigation or design, and must be part of the student's work for a graduate degree. 2. The paper may be co-authored by others, but the student nominee must have been the primary author.
- 3. The paper should be of a quality acceptable for publication in journals such as the AIChE Journal and Chemical Engineering Science.
- 4. Papers will be judged on technical content, quality of writing, and organization.
- 5. The person writing the letter of support must be a member of AIChE.

Current:

5. The person nominating a student must be a member of AIChE.



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Clarence (Larry) G. Gerhold Award

Recognizes an individual's outstanding contribution in research, development, or in the application of chemical separations technology. Starting in 2010 the award will be presented in even years to nominees from industry or non academic entities, and in odd years to nominees from academia. 





2. How would you describe your current position?






5. Are you currently engaging with any of our online programs?






Most respondents would like to see content from SepDiv on a quarterly or monthly basis.

6. Generally, how frequently would you like to see content from the SepDiv Community?


