



corrosion theory; 19th century steel making history. He holds 15 patents for aircraft fuel system and brake products and has coauthored 46 papers in peer reviewed journals. He is actively engaged personally in microbiological and histological studies.

Abstract:

The 19th century was a time of great change in iron and steel making. Massive productivity improvements in iron making occurred starting early in the century with the invention of the hot air blast for the smelting of iron in the blast furnace. By mid-century, steel moved from being a luxury item, made manually and arduously in puddling furnaces, to becoming a commodity by way of invention of the Bessemer (Kelly?) converter and the Siemens-Martin or open hearth furnace. These technologies resulted in the building of great industrial empires. In this talk, I will use historical drawings and photographs to present this fascinating and sometimes sordid history along with the chemistry which added science to the art.

Dual Honors for Bipin Vora

Bipin was elected as a Foreign Fellow of Indian National Academy of Engineering (INAE) and formally was inducted on December 22, 2020 in a virtual ceremony conducted from INAE Center in New Delhi.

On December 8, 2020, National Academy of Inventors (NAI) announced names of 2020 NAI fellows, and Bipin Vora is one of them. Formal induction into NAI will take place in June 2021 in Tampa, Florida at NAI national meeting.

Bipin was inducted in National Academy of Engineering (NAE) in 2018. These are three most prestigious honors in last two
