#### Biography:

Jarad Champion is a licensed chemical engineer in multiple states and a current board member of the American Institute of Chemical Engineers Chicago Section. He is also a board-certified environmental engineer by the American Academy of Environmental Engineers and Scientists. He holds a B.S. in chemical engineering from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign and a M.S. in environmental engineering and science from Northwestern University. He has more than 18 years of experience consulting on hazardous waste remediation and industrial water projects. Mr. Champion's professional activities cover industrial compliance with stormwater and wastewater regulations, hazardous waste remediation, and litigation support throughout the midwest. He is involved in all stages of project

management and implementation, from developing environmental strategies, preparing conceptual-level cost estimates, to sealing final designs, and acting as a prime contractor on construction projects. He is currently a principal engineer with a full-service environmental consulting firm, Geosyntec Consultants.

#### Abstract:

Mr. Champion will be presenting on how the establishment of environmental laws and the promulgation of regulations have affected the coal-fired steam electric generation industry. Over the course of six decades, increasingly stringent environmental regulations specifically targeting coal electric power have resulted in increasing environmental liabilities that will persist beyond power plant closures. Mr. Champion will cover a couple project examples of how chemical and environmental engineering overlap for project solutions. This presentation has been tailored for a university setting.

Dear Sir:-

The Council of the American Institute of Chemical Engineers has unanimously approved the application for a Chicago Section, together with the local officers elected for 1925.

The first regular meting of the Chicago Section will be held Friday, January 16th, 1925 at 7:30 P.H. in the rooms of the Western Society of Engineers (17th Floor, Monadnock Block, 53 W. Jackson Elvd., Chicago).

The business of this meeting will be to consider the proposed By-Laws, copy of which is enclosed herewith. Please comprepared to discuss this question.

After the business of the meeting is disposed of there will be shown a very interesting six reel film of The Life of Pasteur. We have been fortunate to obtain the use of this film which was presented to The United States Government by The French Government.

As this is the initial meeting of the Chicago Section, it is hoped that each member will make a personal effort to be present.



AIChE events provide engineers, scientists, and students a platform to present, discuss, publish and exhibit their discoveries and technical advances.

At all times, volunteers and meeting attendees should act in accordance with AIChE's Code of Ethics, upholding and advancing the integrity, honor and dignity of the chemical engineering profession. AIChE's Board of Directors has developed these guidelines to foster a positive environment of trust, respect, open communications, and ethical behavior. These guidelines apply to meetings, conferences, workshops, courses and other events organized by AIChE or any of its entities and also to volunteers who conduct other business and affairs on behalf of AIChE.

#### Specifically

- 1. Volunteers and meeting attendees should understand and support AIChE's Code of Ethics.
- 2. Volunteers and meeting attendees should contribute to a collegial, inclusive, positive and respectful environment for fellow volunteers and attendees, and other stakeholders, including AIChE staff.

- 3. Volunteers and meeting attendees should avoid making inappropriate statements or taking inappropriate action based on race, gender, age, religion, ethnicity, nationality, sexual orientation, gender expression, gender identity, marital status, political affiliation, presence of disabilities, or educational background. We should show consistent respect for colleagues, regardless of discipline, employment status, and organizations for which they work, whether industry, academia, or government.
