### **March Meeting Information**

### **Biography:**

Dr. Morris is Numat's Director of Business Development, He is responsible for leading business development across several key verticals. In this role, he works with external and internal stakeholders to establish business cases, define technical scopes, and deliver on project milestones.

Prior to this role, Dr. Morris served in a variety of roles at Numat over the past ten years, including Director of Technology, Director of R&D, and Laboratory Chemist. In these roles, he worked as part of the team that successfully commercialized some of the first MOF products. Dr. Morris received his MChem from the University of Manchester and his Ph.D. from the University of California, Los Angeles.

#### Abstract:

Metal-organic frameworks at Numat: A decade of innovation, high-tech manufacturing, and future growth.

Over the past decade, Numat has focused on commercializing metal-organic frameworks (MOFs). To facilitate the commercialization of MOFs, Numat has expanded its team to over eighty individuals with expertise in chemistry, engineering, business development, manufacturing, and quality.

Concentrating on applications characterized by small volumes and high value, Numat has successfully brought MOF products to market, catering to the defense and electronics industries. In 2024, Numat moved to a new domestic manufacturing site with the capacity to produce one hundred tons of MOF-based products per year. This presentation will offer a historical perspective on Numat's growth, discuss challenges in applied research that have been overcome to commercialize MOFs, highlight the new manufacturing site, and provide a perspective on growth areas.

### AIChE Chicago History – Website


The late 1990s were a time when the internet was exploding, and everyone was interested in exploring the world wide web. AIChE Chicago was not going to be left behind and set up its own website -- <u>www.aiche-</u> <u>chicago.org</u>. (NOTE - this domain is no longer owned by AIChE Chicago)

Allan Fluharty, Secretary 1997-1998 and Chair 2001-2002, is believed to have set up the first and most basic version of the website while he was Secretary. While Allan does not recall if he set up the first website or not, there are no currently available records or local section volunteer recollections that refute this. Allan learned HyperText Markup Language (HTML) and used Notepad to write HTML code, since there were no sophisticated web development tools or integrated development environments (IDEs) like we have today. The first web browser, WorldWideWeb (later renamed Nexus), was both a browser and an editor, allowing users to view and edit web pages.

When creating the first website, Allan copied and pasted source code from other websites that he liked. Updating the website meant manually editing the HTML files and uploading them to the server, as there were no content management systems (CMS) or automated tools available at the time. In 1998, Roger Masson (Webmaster 1998-2001) became the section's first official webmaster.

He created multiple pages to highlight the upcoming events and hard work of the many committees, such as the Student Outreach Committee. Roger was not an experienced web designer but was willing to learn HTML from books such as "HTML for Dummies." Roger initially coded the website in HTML in a word processor program or Notepad, similar to Allan. He later obtained Microsoft FrontPage, which made updating and designing the website much faster and more efficient. Websites during this time period mostly text-based with very limited graphics. Images and multimedia content were rare due to slow internet speeds and limited browser capabilities, as most personal internet connections at this time were through dial-up modems.

The AIChE Chicago site was initially hosted on a computer at Northwestern University, through sponsorship from professor Linda Broadbelt. Website updates were done by using FTP (File Transfer Protocol) to upload files. Northwestern continued to host the website until November 2004, when the hard drive on the computer at Northwestern became full. The section then moved the website to the popular web hosting service GoDaddy.

The website continued to be re-designed, updated, or simply maintained based on the help of several webmaster volunteers over the next 10 years including: Ben Geres, Dennis O'Brien, Tom King, Heather Mayers, Janet Werner, Jeff Umbach, and Oleg Yazvin.



### Women in Chemical Engineering: An AIChE Community

The Women's Initiatives Committee was chartered in 1998, with Joan Brennecke (then at the University of Notre Dame, and today at University of Texas at Austin) as its first chair.

Today, WIC is one of AIChE's most active communities, and the committee continues to expand its activities. In addition to AIChE meeting workshops for undergraduates, grad students, and women in academia, recent programming has been dedicated to women in the petrochemicals industries, women in process safety, workplace retention and reentry for women in the profession, and many other topics pertinent to the community.

In a move to better reflect WIC's contributions and leadership role in AIChE and the chemical engineering profession at large, in 2019 the leaders of the Women's Initiative Committee relaunched the group under a new name — Women in Chemical Engineering, an AIChE Community — emphasizing the inclusivity and community aspect of WIC.

The group's mission remains much the same as it was when WIC was first established:

Women in Chemical Engineering, an AIChE Community will lead in promoting the entry, development, and full participation of women in the Institute and the profession through the following strategies:

- Develop/distribute resources on subjects pertaining to women in the profession.
- Mobilize AIChE to meet the needs of existing and potential female members of AIChE and the profession.
- Provide networking means for women in AIChE.
- Increase the visibility of women within AIChE and the profession.

### AIChE Volunteer and Meeting Attendee Conduct Guidelines

AIChE's volunteers are the core of the Institute and make all of its programs, conferences and educational efforts possible. These offerings pro-vide excellent opportunities for AIChE members and meeting attendees to gain greater technical expertise, grow their networks, and enhance their careers. AIChE events provide engineers, scientists, and students a platform to present, discuss, publish and exhibit their discoveries and technical advances. At all times, volunteers and meeting attendees should act in accordance with AIChE's Code of Ethics, upholding and advancing the integrity, honor and dignity of the chemical engineering profession. AIChE's Board of Directors has developed these guidelines to foster a positive environment of trust, respect, open communications, and ethical behavior. These guidelines apply to meetings, conferences, workshops, courses and other events organized by AIChE or any of its entities and also to volunteers who conduct other business and affairs on behalf of AIChE.

### Specifically

1. Volunteers and meeting attendees should understand and support AIChE's Code of Ethics.

2. Volunteers and meeting attendees should contribute to a collegial, inclusive, positive and respectful environment for fellow volunteers and attendees, and other stakeholders, including AIChE staff.

3. Volunteers and meeting attendees should avoid making inappropriate statements or taking inappropriate action based on race, gender, age, religion, ethnicity, nationality, sexual orientation, gender expression, gender identity, marital status, political affiliation,

presence of disabilities, or educational background. We should show consistent respect for colleagues, regardless of discipline, employment status, and organizations for which they work, whether industry, academia, or government.

4. Disruptive, harassing or other inappropriate statements or behavior toward other volunteers, members, and other stakeholders, including AIChE staff, is unacceptable.

5. Volunteers and meeting attendees should obey all applicable laws and regulations of the relevant governmental authorities while volunteering or attending meetings. Volunteers and meeting attendees taking part in any AIChE event, including the ChemECar Competition<sup>™</sup>, should also comply with all applicable safety guidelines. Violations of this conduct policy should be reported promptly to the AIChE President or Executive Director.
