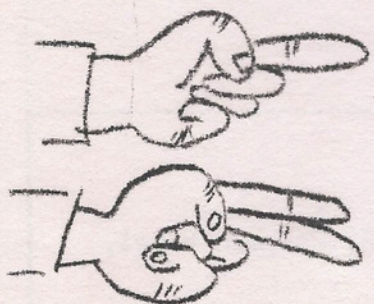

Our January speaker is Mr. Earl H. Shipley, the Division Metallurgist of the Coke and Blast Furnace Division of the United States Steel, Gary Works. His subject will be "The 'NU-IRON' Process."

From 1952 until 1959 Mr. Shipley was employed in the Applied Research Laboratories of United States Steel. During this period of time he worked primarily upon the "NU-IRON" Process. The "NU-IRON" Process converts iron ore directly to iron powder by means of hydrogen. In 1959 Mr. Shipley was transferred to his present job at the Gary Works of US Steel.
