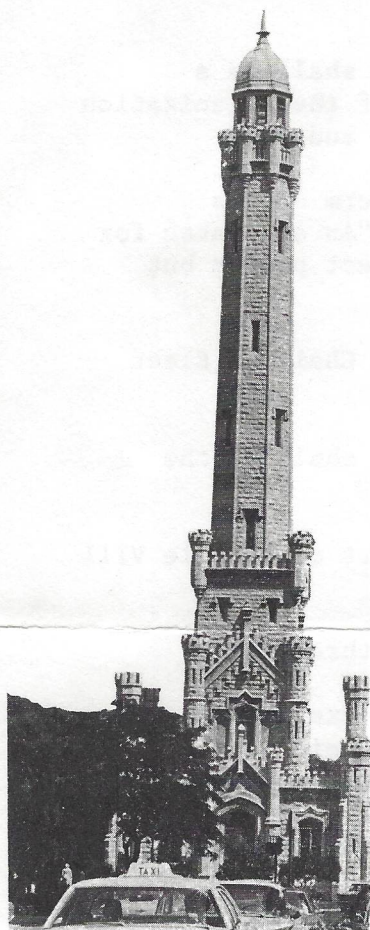

LOCATIONS:

The North Shore Hotel is located at 1611 Chicago Avenue in downtown Evanston. Northwestern's Technological Institute is six (6) blocks north. From all directions use the Edens Expressway and exit Eastbound at Dempster Street. Travel east on Dempster to Chicago Avenue (one block east of viaduct) then turn North (left). The North Shore Hotel is 7-8 blocks north of Dempster. Continue on Chicago Avenue, Sheridan Road merges with Chicago Avenue at the south edge of NU's campus. Parking lots adjacent to the Technological Institute and the Vogelback Computer Center can be used for both the pre-dinner and dinner programs.

CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS COMMITTEE:

With the approval of the Board of Directors, the Constitution and Bylaws Committee submits the following changes to the constitution to the membership for voting at Section meetings and subsequent adoption if carried.

Article V, Section 1. Change from "The officers of the organization shall be a Chairman, a Chairman Elect, a Secretary, and...." to "The officers of the organization shall be a Chairman, a Chairman Elect, a Vice Chairman, a Secretary, and...."

Article V, Section 4: Change from "An appointee for the remaining term of the Chairman Elect shall be called Vice Chairman but shall not...." to "An appointee for the remaining term of the Chairman Elect shall be called Chairman Elect protem but shall not...."

Also change "The Vice-Chairman appointed as above shall...." to "The Chairman Elect protem appointed as above shall...."

Article V, Section 8. Add Section 8 as follows: "The Vice Chairman shall be the Chairman of the Program Committee."

Article V, Sections 2 through 5. These sections should be made a part of Article VIII Amendments.

Renumber Article V, Sections 2 through 5 as Article VIII Sections 4 through 7.

Article V, Section 2. Add Section 2 as follows: "There shall be an Executive Committee consisting of the elected officers of the Section. This committee shall meet at least once each meeting month when there is not a regular board meeting."
