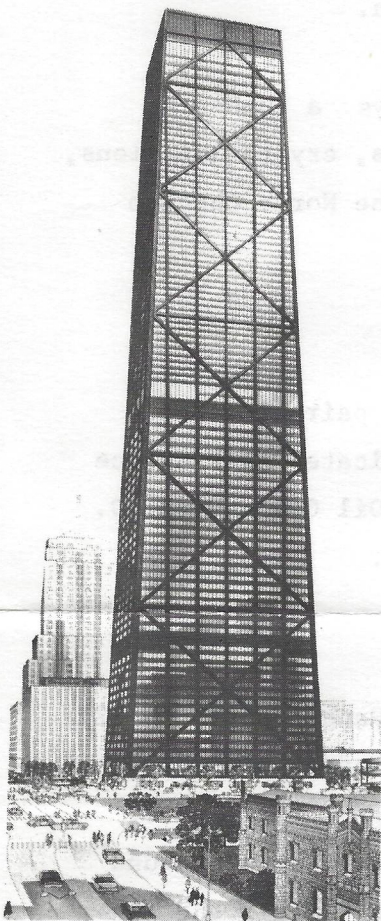

HOST: ABBOTT LABORATORIES

Abbott Laboratories, with its main plant in the city of North Chicago, and its corporate headquarters at Abbott Park, about six miles southwest of the plant, is a diversified producer of health-care products.

The company manufactures and markets pharmaceuticals, hospital products, intravenous solutions and equipment, pediatric products and infant feeding formulas, rubber and plastic goods, radio-pharmaceuticals, eye-care products, medical electronic instruments, animal-health products, blood diagnostics, chemicals, and selected nutritional products.

Abbott and its various divisions also have manufacturing plants in nine other states in the U.S. and in 26 nations overseas. Worldwide, the company employs more than 17,000 persons. Its products are distributed in more than 150 nations. Worldwide sales in 1970 were about \$450 million.

The foundation of Abbott's business historically has been prescription pharmaceutical products. From this foundation, the company has been diversifying its products lines and expanding its commitment to meet the needs of the health-care professions with the same high quality evidenced since 1888.

Abbott depends on research and development for the continuing flow of new, improved drug and other health-care items that are vital to its future and sought by the public that is continuing to grow in health consciousness. Each division has its own research and development capabilities and is able to search for and develop products for use within its own sphere of operations, thus permitting a greater concentration of effort toward a particular need.

Research and development spending in 1971 will approach \$30 million.

As a manufacturer of a wide variety of products, the company employs a number of different manufacturing procedures including product concentrations, crystallizations, and fermentations. About 100 chemical engineers are employed at the North Chicago plant.

LOCATION:

The Old Orchard Country Club is located in Mount Prospect, Il. on Rand Road (U.S. 12) approximately 1 mile northwest of Elmhurst Road (Ill. 83). From Chicago, south and southwest suburbs, take either Interstate 90 or 94 to the pretzel park in front of O'Hare Field. Proceed northbound on Interstate 294 (to Milwaukee). Exit westbound on U.S. 12 - 14 at the DesPlaines - Park Ridge ramp. Bear right on U.S. 12 and continue northwest to Mt. Prospect. From the north use local roads such as U.S. 45 or Ill. 21 continue south on U.S. 45 to Ill. 68 or Willow Road. Take either Ill. 68 or Willow Road west to Ill. 83, Elmhurst Road and go south to U.S. 12. Turn right and proceed 1 mile to the Country Club.
