

SPEAKER AND TALK:

Mr. Johnny Morris will be our after-dinner speaker for the May 12 meeting. The topic of his talk will be, "Sports on TV", which will discuss how sports are brought to the public by the TV medium. Mr. Morris will also present a movie showing the highlights of the Chicago Bears.

An All-Pro football player, a world record performance in track and an accolade as one of the Chicago area's Ten Outstanding Young Men, are among the credentials Johnny Morris brings to his nightly sportscasts on Channel 5. Still a young man, Morris brings his WMAQ-TV viewers first hand knowledge of the sports scene from nearly two decades of active participation on the playing field.

A football and track star at the University of California at Santa Barbara, he tied the world's record for the 50-yard dash as a member of the Santa Barbara track team and was named All-Conference halfback in football. Morris signed with the Chicago Bears in 1958 after graduation from Santa Barbara where he received a bachelors degree in Economics. During his 10 year pro career Johnny hit all the highlights including the College All-Star game, the Pro Bowl and the World Championship game of 1963. He caught 93 passes with the Bears in 1964 to break a 14-year NFL record. When he retired from active playing with the Bears he had caught 356 passes and gained more than 5,000 yards from pass receptions, both career team records.

In 1968, Johnny Morris was named one of the Chicago area's Ten Outstanding Young Men by the Chicago Junior Association of Commerce and Industry.

LOCATIONS AND PARKING:
