

POST-DINNER PROGRAM: "AICHE Problems and Opportunities"

In recent years there has been a great deal of concern over what direction the Institute should be taking to best serve its members. Time and again concern has been expressed about employment practices, secrecy clauses, portable pensions and the Institute's role in providing for a better society. This month's presentation is aimed at answering some of these questions.

The underlying philosophy of a technical or professional society will be discussed and suggestions for suitable objectives and activities will be considered. The problems to which Council has been devoting the bulk of its attention will be reviewed, and opinions from the audience will be solicited on the pros and cons of relative positions on these problems. The advantages and disadvantages of professional society activities will be treated and, hopefully, the opportunities will be revealed to those who are interested in availing themselves of them.

Speaker: Dr. J. J. Martin, Professor of Chemical Engineering, University of Michigan

After receiving his Ph.D. in 1947 from Carnegie Mellon University, Dr. Martin joined the staff at the University of Michigan. He subsequently was promoted to Associate Professor in 1950, and Professor in 1956. In addition to his duties in the Chemical Engineering Department, Dr. Martin is also the Assistant Director of the Institute of Science and Technology at the University.

Dr. Martin has served the Institute on a number of committees. He was elected a Director in 1967, Vice President in 1970 and President in 1971. In addition to AIChE, he is also active in the American Chemical Society and the American Society for Engineering Education.
