#### **Topic**

The April meeting is to be our annual Students
Night, to take place this year at the University of
Illinois at Chicago. Students from all three local
Chemical Engineering departments (UIC, IIT, and
NWU) are especially invited to attend, and to
participate in the student poster exhibition. This
is a great opportunity for our local students to
demonstrate to chemical engineering
professionals what they are accomplishing in
their studies. Engineers (especially those whose
companies are looking for excellent new
employees) are urged to attend and see the
accomplishments of the current crop of
upcoming graduates.

The speaker will be Professor Emeritus R. Byron Bird, of the Department of Chemical Engineering at the University of Wisconsin at Madison. The title of Dr. Bird's talk will be "Who Was Who in Transport Phenomena". To quote from Dr. Bird's description in his cover letter, this talk will be:

"a discussion only of the contributions by those who are no longer living. I hope it will give the students an appreciation of the fascinating people who have gone before and make such names as Fourier, Planck, Prandtl, Nusselt, Fanning, etc. come alive."

This talk promises to provide interesting vignettes into the personal lives and idiosyncrasies of the featured subjects, NOT a dry technical lecture.

#### Speaker

Dr. R. Byron Bird

Dr. Bird is well known as one of the three co-authors of "Transport Phenomena" by Bird, Stewart, and Lightfoot - a book that nearly every chemical student has used since it was first published in 1960. He received the National Medal of Science from President Reagan, is a Member of the National Academy of Engineering and of the National Academy of Sciences, is a Fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and a Foreign Member of the Royal Dutch Academy of Sciences and the Royal Belgian Academy of Sciences.

His awards from AICHE include the Warren K.
Lewis Award, the Professional Progress Award, the
William H. Walker Award, the Founders Award, and
the Institute Lecturer Award (serving as the main
keynote speaker at an annual AIChE meeting).
He possesses nine Honorary Doctorates, including
institutes in Japan, Israel, Switzerland, and
the Netherlands.

Less well known to the average chemical engineer

is Dr. Bird's breadth of skills in the Liberal Arts fields as well as his science. He speaks many languages fluently, including Dutch, Japanese, French, and German, including authored books in Dutch and Japanese. He is also a poet, a musician, and a canoeist familiar with the Canadian boundary waters. Dr. Bird is an excellent example of how excellence in science and liberal arts do not have to be mutually exclusive, and can in fact be mutually supportive.

#### **Directions to UIC**

The CCC building is located at 750 S. Halsted Street between Harrison and Taylor. Parking is available across the street.

#### By car:

From the north, take the Kennedy Expressway to the Eisenhower Expressway west bound and keep to the right; take the first exit from the Eisenhower Expressway, which is Morgan Street; then take Morgan Street south one block to the campus.

From the south, take the Dan Ryan Expressway and exit on Roosevelt Road (1200 south); go west on Roosevelt Road to Halsted Street; then go north on Halsted Street to the campus.

From the west, take the Eisenhower Expressway to the Racine Ave. exit; then go south to Harrison Street and east to the campus.

From the east, take Harrison Street or Roosevelt Road; if you take Roosevelt Road, go west to Halsted Street and turn north to the campus.

#### By train:
