
Tina Tullberg and Larry Hartl from CPS Employment Services, Inc.

New Reservation Policy

An evaluation of the AIChE Chicago Section finances has determined that the Section often incurs losses for the monthly meetings. Members making reservations for the dinner and then not attending the meeting accounts for one of the reasons for the deficit. Additionally, the Section has absorbed the dinner costs for students.

We understand that as professionals, we sometimes have to make last minute adjustments to our schedules, which may prevent us from attending a meeting. However, it hardly seems reasonable to ask Chicago Section members to absorb the costs for dinners for those that make reservations and then are not able to attend. Therefore, on behalf of the AIChE Chicago Section Members, if you make a reservation for a meeting and later find that you cannot attend, we request that you reimburse the Section for the cost of the dinner. Starting November 2004, the committee will send letters to such members to recover the cost of the dinner, as the expense is incurred by the Section and our finances do not have a provision for such losses. We appreciate your cooperation and hope that this will resolve one issue that accounts for monthly meeting deficits.

To help lessen the losses incurred from paying for student dinners, we are asking that students pay \$5.00 for each meeting they attend.
